BOGNOR REGIS FAQs

How big is the new pool?

Our new pool is 6,300m² which is 1,500m² bigger than the original pool at Bognor Regis.

How many guests can the new pool hold?

We can welcome a maximum of 950 guests at any one time to our new pool.

How much did the new pool cost?

We know how important an amazing swimming pool is to you and your family and what an impact it makes on your break; that's why we've invested a huge £40 million building our new pool.

Are there any restrictions on entry with regards to adult/child bather ratios?

In any pool area within the new pool, there must be one adult to two children for any child under the age of 8 years, and for any child under the age of 14 years who is either a weak or non-swimmer.

How many rides and slides are there?

There are seven brilliant rides in our new pool, including some extra-special seaside-themed ones for the whole family to enjoy. See our website for our height and age restrictions.

If I don't want to go on the rides or in the wave pool, is there somewhere I can swim?

Absolutely. We have a lovely lido area for swimming and relaxing that's away from the wave pool and slides.

What are the changing rooms like?

We've worked with Mumsnet to design practical changing rooms for families of all shapes and sizes. We've got adapted changing rooms, bigger family cubicles and more of them, heated floors and larger lockers.

What time is the pool open?

The pool is open on every break, you can see the opening times in the app or on your What's On guide two weeks before your break.

Can we use the pool as a day visitor?

Yes, you can enjoy our new pool during the afternoon with a day visit ticket.

Is there somewhere to relax, poolside?

Around our lido area, you'll find loungers and four beautiful seaside huts for relaxing.

Is there a viewing area?

Our café and viewing area is currently closed.

Is there an area for my little ones?

Yes! The Seaside Playground is our dedicated tots' area for babies and children up to age 5. The water depth is beached to 0.4m and is heated to a constant 30 degrees.

Does my child need to wear a swim nappy?

All children who aren't toilet trained must wear a clean swimming nappy with snug fitting waterproof swimming pants over the top.

Are there any other swimwear rules?

Shorts up to 3/4 length are allowed. If you're wearing leggings, full-body swimwear or t-shirts on religious grounds, these must be clean and tight-fitting with a costume worn underneath. Goggles and some jewellery are allowed but must be removed on the flumes. Please note snorkels are not allowed.

Can I bring inflatables in?

Inflatables such as lilos, boats, beach balls and inflatable animals are not permitted in the pool, however, swimming aids including armbands, swim rings and baby swim seats are allowed.

Is the pool accessible for all?

Yes, we've designed our new pool for everyone to enjoy.

- Level access is provided at all entry and exit points to the building, to the pool hall from the changing rooms, and from the café to the external terrace
- There is an accessible WC located within the entrance area, adjacent to the café
- A wet wheelchair is available
- The lido pool is accessed via steps, although a portable hoist suitable for entry into the water is available on request
- All other pool areas have ramped beach access into the water

Please note, wheelchair users are not able to get to our flumes and slides as these are accessed via stairs.

Can I take any food or drink poolside?

Unfortunately food and drink is not permitted poolside.

Can I use my B-Line Pass?

No, B-Line Passes do not allow access to the pool earlier or ahead of anyone else.

TOP TIP

There are different sized lockers for all family types - don't forget to bring a £1 coin for them (it's refundable) and some extra swimming towels with you!
